

# UNAIDS Programme Coordinating Board Thematic Segment on TB – 23 April 2008, Chiang Mai, Thailand

Diagnosis and treatment of tuberculosis (TB) among people living with HIV and how UNAIDS can work with TB communities

#### Rationale

Tuberculosis (TB) remains one of the most important causes of illness and death among people living with HIV, despite the fact that TB is mostly preventable and curable. At least 11 million people living with HIV are also infected with TB and at increased risk of developing TB disease. Chronic lack of investment in TB control programmes and TB research has resulted in inadequate prevention, diagnosis and treatment of TB and the development and spread of drug-resistant forms of TB that disproportionately affect people living with HIV. Furthermore, the TB programme in many countries can be a highly effective but often underutilized partner in accelerating towards universal access to HIV prevention, treatment, care and support.

The Programme Coordinating Board is the governing body of UNAIDS. In addition to the main business component, each PCB meeting has a thematic session which explores topics of importance to the UNAIDS programme outside the constraints of the formal PCB sessions. This thematic session intends to explore the threat that TB poses for people living with HIV and how the HIV community can work with TB programmes to reduce the burden of both diseases.

#### Aims of the segment

The over-arching aims of the sessions throughout the segment are to:

- Showcase the benefits of a joint HIV/TB approach to scaling up towards universal access;
- Highlight the need to address tuberculosis within the comprehensive response to HIV; and
- Build commitment to integrated delivery of quality HIV and TB prevention, treatment, care and support services.
