Annex II to the document 2006–2007 Unified Budget and Workplan Proposed Realignment contains details on the proposals of the UNAIDS Cosponsoring Organizations and the Secretariat. At the time that Annex II was prepared and distributed to PCB members the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) had not submitted details on the proposed changes to its key results.

During the past several months UNDP has undertaken an intensive process to prepare the proposed revisions to prioritize GTT commitments and UNDP's responsibilities. UNDP also aligned its key results under the UBW with its new HIV service lines under UNDP's strategic results framework. This will help to ensure that UNDP's internal reporting across country, regional and global levels is coherent with UBW reporting.

This addendum contains details on UNDP's proposals on the revision of the 2006–2007 Unified Budget and Workplan.
