UNAIDS Strategy

At its 25th meeting, PCB requested UNAIDS to

Develop a new mission statement with measurable and time-bound objectives supported by a new strategic plan which reinforces UNAIDS in its political and advocacy roles and clarifies how the Joint Programme will position itself to re-focus support at regional and country level to reflect the epidemic context and country needs



Transformation imperative

Reframing HIV response is critical at this pivotal juncture

- Progress scaling up treatment & stabilising/decreasing incidence
- But we are challenged by
 - Flat-lining resources
 - Fragmented & generic responses
 - 10 million people need treatment
 - Weak systems
 - Social injustice
- We must seize opportunities
 - Retter tools to measure incidence
 - Retter strategic information—drivers of vulnerability
 - Momentum in development of better prevention tools
 - Political shifts that can produce breakthrough progress



Transformation agenda

Focus and efficiency to radically reduce new infections

- Focus Directing resources to where they have most impact on the epidemic—to hotspots, interventions, countries
- Efficiency Reducing unit cost, innovative delivery systems, involving communities, integrating services
- Partnership Supporting country ownership and south-south cooperation, engaging communities and emerging economies
- Enhancing mutual accountability through shared ownership
 - Reople
 - Countries
 - Synergies



Strategic Directions

Revolutionising HIV prevention

- Report Political Commitment to why people are getting infected
- Communities demand transformative change
- Resources directed to hotspots and what works

Catalysing the next phase of treatment, care & support

- Access to effective treatment when people need it
- Strong national & community systems
- Access to care, support & social protection

Advancing human rights & gender equality

- Protective social & legal environments enable access
- Equitable service provision reaches people most in need
- X HIV-related needs and rights women and girls addressed

Goals for 2015

Revolutionise HIV prevention

- Sexual transmission of HIV reduced by half, including among young people, men who have sex with men and transmission in the context of sex work
- Vertical transmission of HIV eliminated and AIDS-related maternal deaths reduced by half
- All new HIV infections prevented among people who use drugs

Catalyse the next phase of treatment, care and support

- Universal access to antiretroviral therapy for people living with HIV who are eligible for treatment
- TB deaths among people living with HIV reduced by half
- People living with HIV and households affected by HIV are addressed in all national social protection strategies and have access to essential care and support

Advance human rights and gender equality

- Countries with punitive laws and practices around HIV transmission, sex work, drug use or homosexuality reduced by half
- HIV-related restrictions on entry, stay and residence eliminated in half of the countries that have such restrictions
- Zero tolerance for gender-based violence
- HIV-specific needs of women and girls addressed in at least half of all national HIV responses

Goals for 2015

Concrete, ambitious yet achievable milestones

- Ten concrete medium-term milestones on road to long-term vision (not time bound)
- Established to guide global response and Joint Programme
- Ambitious UNAIDS role to lead and inspire
- Evolved from Outcome Framework priority area working groups
- Capture areas where real progress is needed




Operationalising the Strategy

 - Partnership Strategy




Proposed Results Structure of the Unified Budget and Accountability Framework (UBAF)



2010 Division of Labour

- Accentuates comparative advantages of Joint Programme to enhance efficiency and effectiveness
- Leverages organisational mandates & resources to deliver results
- Optimises Joint Programmes support for Strategy goals and corporate priorities
- Each DoL Area has Convening Agencies
 (not lead) to facilitate broader contribution & ensure quality of results
- Secretariat role to provide overall leadership and coordination and support accountability





Process of development

- Bangkok multi-stakeholder consultation
- Bilateral interviews with select PCB members
- Consultations at the IAC Vienna
- Zero draft to Cosponsors mid-August
- First draft circulated September
- Second draft circulated October
- Final to Board end November
- Extensive comments from Missions, NGOs, Friends and Cosponsors
- Endorsement at the PCB



Moving forward

Dec 2010

- Strategy endorsed by PCB
- PCB sub-committee begins work on UBAF to operationalise Strategy

Jan 2011

- Strategy begins to guide global AIDS response & UNAIDS work
- UNAIDS work plans for 2011 reviewed & refined as necessary to reflect Strategic Directions, goals & objectives

Jun 2011

- Targets, indicators & baselines identified prior & following HLM
- Budget & accountability framework for 2012 2015 presented to PCB

Jun 2012

 Starting June 2012, progress in implementing the Strategy reported to the Board annually, as part of regular reporting to the PCB
